ADAMI Media Prize 2018 Competition Nominees

Tbilisi, 5 November, 2018

After an intensive working session in Odessa, Ukraine, the ADAMI Media Prize for Cultural Diversity in Eastern Europe is honored to announce its nominees of the ADAMI Media Prize 2018 competition.

The ADAMI jury sessions took place at Impact Hub Odessa. Twenty-two international jury members were tasked with selecting the nominees and prize winners from 311 submitted TV broadcasts, online videos and web pages promoting national, ethnic, religious or cultural diversity issues from the six Eastern Partnership countries of the European Union (Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova, Ukraine). The jury panels were composed of representatives of broadcasters, online media outlets and international organizations from both Western European and the Eastern Partnership countries.
