ADAMI Dialogue seminar for TV and film professionals begins in Yerevan

ADAMI Media Prize for Cultural Diversity in Eastern Europe is holding the ADAMI Dialogue forum in Yerevan the capital of Armenia on November 4-5, 2017.

The forum creates a platform for TV, media, and film professionals from the EU Eastern Partnership countries to present their video-based projects on cultural diversity and integration. 18 professionals from Armenia, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova, and Ukraine are participating in the forum to receive individual consultations from international experts on developing their films.

Seminar mentors include documentary filmmaker Vitaly Mansky (Latvia/Russia); producer and film director Andrzej Klamt (Germany); filmmaker Irene Langemann (Germany); Arte senior reporter Vladimir Vasak (France); journalist Satik Seyranyan (Armenia); and scriptwriter Konstantin Jandieri (Georgia).

Within the framework of the forum, there will be a screening open to the public of the film RODNYE (CLOSE RELATIVES) and a Q&A session with the film's director, Vitaly Mansky. The screening will be on November 4, 2017 at 19:00 at the Malyan Theatre. Entrance is free.

About the ADAMI Media Prize

The ADAMI Media Prize was created to encourage filmmakers, journalists, and audio-visual media professionals in the EU Eastern Partnership countries to promote topics of migration, tolerance, and cultural diversity. The prize rewards outstanding TV, film, and online programmes which deal with diversity-related issues. Alongside the prize, ADAMI organizes several events for networking and fosters exchange among media professionals in Eastern Europe and the EU.
